


## 🎨 Year 6 Home Learning Project: Dig for Victory 🎨

<p>Make your own model tank out of cardboard.</p>	<p>Write a newspaper report about a significant event during WWII</p>	<p>Make a drawing, painting or collage of a WWII scene.</p>
<p>Research and create a fact file about a famous figure from WWII.</p>	<p>Write a dinner recipe using ingredients only available during rationing.</p>  <p>The infographic titled 'War time recipes' lists three recipes: 'Carrot fudge', 'Potato sponge', and 'Potato scones'. Each recipe includes a list of ingredients and step-by-step instructions. For example, 'Carrot fudge' requires 4 tablespoons of grated carrot, 1 packet of jelly, orange marmalade, and raisins. 'Potato sponge' uses 200g of flour, 150g of sugar, 25g of butter, 25g of raw grated potato, 1 teaspoon of baking powder, and a pinch of salt. 'Potato scones' need 150g of flour, 25g of melted butter, 1 teaspoon of baking powder, 1 egg yolk, 25g of butter, and 4 tablespoons of milk.</p>	<p>Make a model of the air raid shelter that we designed in our recent topic lessons.</p>
